
Library

Colette was not only an active member of Mary Circle but also served as Moderator of Presbyterian Women Group and Chairperson of the Missions Committee. With that in mind, the book chosen is a memoir about a young American woman, Megan Boudreaux. In 2010, at the age of 24, she sold everything and went to Haiti to found an organization called Respire Haiti. Her mission was "to fight for the freedom of Haiti's estimated 300,000 child slaves." The book is titled "Miracle on Voodoo Mountain." If you go the Respire Haiti website you'll see that today this organization now has a Christian school, a medical clinic and a food distribution program, as well as other social programs.

I hope all will be inspired by Colette's example, and this book, to continue supporting the various missions our church sponsors.




