BUILDING BRIDGES TOGETHER

To my new friends at Northminster, grace and peace be with you! I have been with you as your Transitional Pastor for a couple of weeks, and have appreciated the warm welcome you and the staff have given my husband Ron, and me. Thank you! On a personal note, Ron and I have been married for 35 years. We're parents of three and grandparents to 7, and have been privileged to watch our family grow up physically, spiritually, and professionally. We are "tree-hugging" vegans, so I've learned a new way of preparing plant-based meals, and we're staying healthier and more mindful of God's bounty.



We also love to travel, having completed 7 home exchanges all over the world. Daily walks round off some physical activities; participating in several Bible studies feed our souls.

I was called to Northminster Presbyterian Church because you are "in transition," as you said goodbye to Pastor Wally and Joyce, and long-time faithful servant, Isabel Oake. The root word for the verb, transition, in the Latin is *transio* – which means "to go across." So, in the coming year, we will "go across" from one place to another in the life of the church. This brings to mind a few questions we can explore together. First, just where are we now? Like MapQuest asks, "what is your current location?" And then what is our destination? To where are we crossing? Other questions come to mind when we consider the journey: Just what are we crossing over? What do we take for the journey, and what do we leave behind? What can we see clearly, and what is hidden from us as we go?

Well, in all this it occurs to me if we are going to "go across" to the future, we need some kind of bridge. A bridge is built to allow people to transition thoughtfully, carefully, safely. Imagine again, what could lie

beneath a bridge? Darkness? Raging water, deep canyon, rocky cliffs? So then, what might be the pitfalls and dangers the congregation must cross over to the future? Fear? Worry? Grief? Technology challenges. Budget constraints. Culture shifts. Aging? Uncertainty? How do we navigate all that?

But look at it this way: Like you might stand on a viewing bridge overlooking the Grand Canyon, or some other breathtaking sight, a bridge can allow us to pause in safety, stand in awe of God's creation, and see the thrilling plans God has before you. Mission. Conversions. New members. Glorious worship expressions. And to feel the power and majesty of divine possibility.

God has provided Northminster a steady bridge...me! Well maybe I'm more of a bridge engineer, and we are all building the bridge together, in God's strength. I'm grateful God has called me "for such a time as this" in the life of this congregation! I am committed to offer the love and hope of Jesus Christ to you through worship, preaching, teaching, pastoral care, and leadership, as we continue to transition together into your future. I have always been passionate about equipping the saints for the work of evangelism, mission, and service. I am also passionate for the next generations to come to know Jesus, and to find their value in God's sight. To reach new generations of believers, we shall have to build more new bridges, and dare to walk across them. But as God has always done in my life, God will show us the way across the divide. Together. And God goes with us.

This past year, under Covid restrictions, we might have had to stay put for a while. But soon we shall be ready to cross over in safety, joy and awe to what God has prepared for us. May the season of Lent be a time to reflect on the eternal Bridge that is Jesus; to strengthen your relationship with the One who has brought you this far, and Who is leading you on, for His glory and purpose.
